What is going on along Main Street? Why the yellow tape, etc? *One of the items of suggested improvements that came from our visitors through the First Impressions program was that we needed to do something to improve our flower planters. We formed a follow-up committee (referred to as the First Impressions Follow-up committee). They reviewed the report, viewed the Village, and made recommendations to the Village Board. One of the recommendations was to cement in the current flower boxes and come up with a new plan for flower containers. After this was discussed at several public meetings and two public Village Board meetings, the Village Board voted to cement in the flower boxes. (actually done 9-19-13). Additionally, they asked the First Impressions follow-up committee to continue looking at ways to have flowers displayed on Main Street. One current idea is to have old chairs with flower pots on them. The final decision has not been made yet, and the Village Board is looking forward to hearing more recommendations from the committee. This committee is also getting a bid for a sound system for Main Street. So the short answer to the two questions: 1. the old flower planters will be cemented in. 2. The old mulch around the Memorial trees was removed, and will be replaced in the spring. If you would like to have a say in the flower display being discussed for Main Street, the First Impressions follow-up committee is looking for additional members and input. Contact Marilyn Newman if you would be willing to help.

On October 19th, a Small Business Seminar is being sponsored. It will be held at the Medford High School from 8.am to 3:30pm. The featured speaker will be Dave Anderson of Famous Dave's Restaurants. There will be breakout sessions for agri business, small business, and tourism with lots of ideas and discussion. The cost is only \$25 for 2 persons which includes breakfast and lunch. SIDEWALK CLEANING REMINDER FOR WINTER 2013-14

If you have a sidewalk in front of your house, business, or lot, you are obligated to clean the sidewalk. You shall keep all sidewalks in good sufficient safe repair and free of any snow, ice, or dirt. If you fail to clean the sidewalk, the Village will clean it at the homeowner's expense.

APPLICATIONS AVAILABLE IN THE VILLAGE CLERK'S OFFICE

The Village Clerk's Office administers many applications for the Village Board. Applications that you can procure through the Village Clerk's Office are as follows:

<u>*RLF FUNDS*</u>- a Small business or an individual can come and fill out a loan application for funds for starting a business or expanding the business. There is an RLF committee. The Committee will review the loan and funding. <u>*Park Applications*</u> – This is to reserve the park for private parties, family reunions, ball games, etc. There are park applications in the clerk's office- \$50 deposit per day.

<u>Building Permits</u> – This is for any new buildings and remodeling done over \$2000 in value. Roofing does not require a building permit if the structure of the roof is unchanged. These permits are \$25.00 for the permit and \$1.00 for each \$10,000 worth of work for residential and \$50.00 for permit and \$5.00 for each \$10,000 worth of work for commercial. <u>CDBG Loan Application</u> – Come into the Clerk's Office for more information and an application for a NO Interest Loan for remodeling of your home.

<u>Voter Registration</u> - This application is required for all new electors who move into the Village or have changed their name or their address since the last election. A change in residency form will be sent to the former municipality. <u>Absentee Ballot Reguests</u> – This would be requested if an elector was unable to come to the Municipal Building on Election Day but still wanted to vote.
